Extra Practice Activity #3:Oral Reading Fluency Passage 7- Suntans and Fun at the Beach

Goal: Increase student's oral reading fluency rate and accuracy.

Materials:

Oral Reading Fluency Story- Suntans and Fun at the Beach (provided in the Resource List below).

- 1. Your child can practice his/her oral reading fluency with the grade level probe provided each week. You can have them read it multiple times, trying to improve their fluency (words correct per minute) each time.
- 2. If you would like, you can calculate his/her actual words correct per minute (wcpm). Instruct your child to read each story out loud and start a timer when the student reads the first word. Stop the student after 60 seconds. You would also need to count the number of errors he/she makes while reading and know which word he/she stops on.
